

Ishi Archery Club, Inc.
Meeting Minutes
Thursday, January 6, 2011

The meeting was called to order by James Buckley at 6:45 PM. Those attending were Jeanne George, Phil Raglin, Jon Luis, Jon Ward, Leland George, Jim Humphreys, Rod Swain, Mike Hall and James Buckley. The December 2nd minutes were approved. The secretary plans to mail and e-mail a newsletter by mid-January. Currently, there are 52 households. The annual liability insurance was paid \$357.20. A flyer and e-mail was received regarding having a booth at the Sportsman's Expo, April 9-10 in Chico. No interest was given.

No Treasurer's Report was given. Pierre Peets submitted a bill of \$252.76 for arrows for the youth program. Others bills were from Norms for printing costs (\$11.37) and annual rental for the private mail box (\$70.00). James was reimbursed for the new locks for the storage containers (approximately \$50). The treasurer was requested to make an end of the year report of gross income and total expenses for Jesse Sisneros to file the state/federal tax filings. A committee to audit the 2010 books will be appointed next meeting.

After discussion, Phil agreed to coordinate the Indoor Shoots for competition and awards. He has the handicap chart from Pierre. There will be teams of two randomly selected. James will get scorecards. The competition shooting will begin at 6 PM. Because of the small turnout during December, there will be NO indoor shoot scheduled for December 2011 except for the dinner. Leland will contact the Bull Sale regarding dismantling Friday, Jan 21, if needed, and re-set on Wednesday, Feb 2nd

Leland George reported that the Youth Shoot began last night with over 25 kids participating. James Buckley and Linda Smith, Ishi members, are being trained to be 4-H leaders. He is thankful for their volunteering to help lead this outreach project.

Work Parties are scheduled for the 3rd Saturday of each month -- January 21, February 19 and March 19 to repair target butts from practice range and get the range ready for the tournaments. Work Parties on Wednesdays at 9 AM will continue, weather permitting. A motion was made and seconded and approved to purchase two rolls of ¾ inch galvanized strapping to hold the carpet butts securely. James will purchase.

Phil Raglin reported that he is waiting for Outback Construction to smooth the practice range for further development. James reported they are set to go when the weather improves.

James appointed Phil and Pierre to finalize the work to be done by Outback Construction on the west and east sides of the range. The plan includes building a road around/through the 42 butts as a fire break but also easy assessing for 3-D target placements. The rocks on the practice range will be removed and smoothed for mowing. Need also to level areas for the placement of containers. And gravel areas by registration and chicken shack.

The purchase of another storage container to be placed by the registration area is on hold until the weather improves. The two existing containers will be moved to the north end, weather permitting as voted upon in Feb 2010.

The next tournament will be held Sunday, March 27th. Volunteers are needed to help with registration, food concessions, and general clean up of the range. Zach, as range captain, will handle the repair and set up of 3D Targets. Leland & Rod volunteered to buy and cook at one of

the concession stands. Jon Ward is willing to cook tri tip, if wanted. Jeanne will check the supply of awards. Jeanne will mail flyers to local archery shops and clubs soon and postcard to previous shooters in February. The flyers were reviewed accuracy. The shoot will be 42 targets, weather permitting.

The 3rd Annual Ishi Club Invitational Youth Only Shoot will be Sunday, March 20th. Leland will coordinate the day. Youth Shooters must be supervised by an adult; \$5 per shooter. It will be same as 2010. Sponsors will be solicited for door prizes and Ishi pins will be given as awards. There will be 28 targets, 3-D and paper but we will inter mix them to create a more variety for the youth while shooting.

We had a break-in the week of December 13th. The air compressor & generator were stolen; three locks were cut; gate and both storage sheds. It was decided to fully secure the sheds would be costly. And if someone really wanted in they could just cut a hole in the top or sides. It was decided NOT to purchase another generator. Many members have one to load for a day, if needed. The air compressor is only used to blow up balloons and we can determine the need if we do the fair booth again. Leland will purchase two additional combination locks same style as before.

The next meeting will be held on Thursday, February 3rd during the Indoor Shoot; around 6:30 – 7:30 PM.
