

Ishi Archery Club, Inc.

Meeting Minutes Thursday, September 16, 2011 7:00 PM at Luigi's Pizza, Red Bluff

The meeting was called to order at 7 PM by President James Buckley. Due to the small attendance, introductions were not given. Those attending were Bill Heins, Leland George, Jeanne George, James Buckley, and Rachel Lotze. The June 16th minutes were not approved due to the lack of the June meeting attendees.

Jeanne presented the summer issues of CBH/SAA News for review. The Late Summer Ishi Club newsletter was mailed late August to all current members. Another newsletter will be mailed in late October. We currently have 56 households. We still need to pay 2011 dues. The dues are actually due in the spring but Ishi has been paying the dues in the Fall. Therefore, we are trying to change our process. Therefore, Jeanne will request the treasurer to pay the difference from 2010 fall membership to 2011 late spring membership for the current year. Then, we will pay dues again in Spring 2012. There were 77 members in June 2011; Jeanne will review her records or check with Phil as to how much was paid in Fall 2010. Bill Heins was congratulated on being awarded the 2012 CBH Hall of Fame. He will be presented at the annual meeting in Stockton in January. We need to encourage Ishi members to attend.

Ishi received a letter from Tehama District Fair as to the increase of rental of 10%. Therefore, the indoor shoot will cost about \$10 more each night. Jeanne received a request to give a presentation to families on October 1st about youth activities in Tehama County presented by United Way. No one expressed an interest.

Phil was not present and did not send a Treasurer's Report. Jeanne has a bill for \$27 for postage stamps for the newsletter.

James reported that Outback Construction will begin work on the range immediately after the first rain. The next work party will be in November. James will check with Zach as to what Saturday or Sunday is best for him. No further committee reports were given.

Tehama District Fair is September 22-25. Phil is in charge of ordering balloons and recruiting volunteers to work the booth. Leland will set up on Wednesday, September 21st at 9 AM. He will double check the condition of the bows and arrows. Bill Heins will inspect the booth for safety according to NFAA guidelines.

Dates for our 2012 tournaments must be reported by October 15th. The following were approved . . . March 25 (4th Sunday) – Spring Fling and May 20 (3rd Sunday) – Rock Festival

The Annual Ishi Club Invitational Youth Shoot will be held on Sunday, April 29 (5th Sunday). There will be 28 3-D targets that were used at the March shoot; no new targets. The goal is to recognize all shooters for their effort. It was agreed to give all youth a participation pin (new design) & give 1st -3rd place ribbons per NFAA class. Adults may ONLY shoot if they attend with youth shooters. There will be no awards for adults. The cost per shooter will be still be \$5 with a \$20 maximum per family (parents & immediate children). Jeanne will start getting raffle prizes soon . . . she would like to get some big items from Bass Pro, Cabelas, Reinhardt, and Sportsman's Warehouse.

The Club Turkey Shoot will be held Saturday, November 12. We will have 28 paper turkey targets. Unsure if targets need to be ordered; it is believed that Phil has the targets from 2010. James will contact Zach and have him follow up. The event is free to current members and \$10 for guests of all ages. \$15 gift certificates at Raleys will be given to the top score and for every fifth scoring shooter (5th, 10th, 15th, etc.) based upon highest to lowest scores; no classes or styles.

The quoted price for a signature target is \$3,000-3,500. It was decided that it was not a wise investment at this time. We need to concentrate on the range improvements first.

The Indoor Winter League will be held on Thursdays beginning in January and will end in late February unless attendance warrants more or less nights. The building will not be available the fourth week of January; Bull Sale. The rental cost will be \$94 per night plus the cost of the targets. Youth night will continue on Wednesdays, if there is enough participation. The cost per shooter will stay the same as 2010; \$5 members and \$6 guests; \$5 student both nights. It was discussed if there are few shooters for either night, only one night could be designated with 3-5 PM for club and 5-7 youth and 7-9 club again.

Due to the costs of the fairgrounds, it was decided to have the Holiday Dinner the first night of the club Indoor ... Thursday, January 5th. Costs per member and other details were not discussed. The election of officers will be held at the January dinner meeting with nominations in November.

Leland expressed an interest in ordering T-shirts and decals again. Leland also reported Dick Enck expressed an interest in attending our shoots to design and make printed t-shirts on site. Leland will follow up.

Next meeting will be November 3rd at 7 PM at Luigi's, Red Bluff.
